Pastor offered prayer

Becky Hill showed the results presentation from Consultant Kellen Rogenbach

Pastor Daniel circulated a handout on the commitment of Church Council members.

Treasurer's report Motion to approve by Mark, seconded by Ellen, all in favor. Fred mentioned the annual licensing were in this month.

Announcement for Leadership meeting, game night, and Joint Council Meeting,

Pastor Daniel made announcements concerning a Quilt Auction for Lutherdale Bible Camp and the disbanding of the "Women of ELCA" He said his installation would take place either July 10 or 17th. He said he would be out of town July 6th through 9th. August 4 - 7 Pastor will be attending a retreat. July 27 - 30 a youth group event will take place. The congregation to donate \$100 per youth toward registration fee.

Pastor introduced a discussion of the possibility of going back to communion service with out the disposable pre-filled cartons except on request and the need for an Alter Care Communion Assistant.
