Pastor's Column



Throughout the season of Lent, we've been exploring the theme "Seeking: Honest Questions for Deeper Faith." Lent is a season for wandering through wilderness, exploring, wondering, and questioning. At the end of our Lenten journey is the Good Friday story of the cross, the place where we see God's love most fully revealed as Jesus lays down his life for our sake.

And then comes Easter. Easter is the ultimate answer to all the questions we've asked. Easter is the climax of the story, the moment when we see the proof that Jesus is who he is. It's the proof of death's defeat. The empty tomb declares that the cross was God's moment of triumph, rather than the defeat it appeared to be. We gather together to sing in celebration, joyfully proclaiming, "Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!"

And yet, Easter brings up another question: So what? What do we do with the news that Jesus is alive? Where do we go from here? How do we respond to the promise that death has been defeated, the promise that God's kingdom has broken into our world?

The past few months have been full of winter fun for the Lighthouse youth!



We kicked off the new year with a game night and assembled birthday kits for the local food pantries. In February, a group of 7 students (6 of whom are members at Living Hope and Christ the King) and 3 adults attended the Quake youth retreat in the WI Dells. This was an awesome weekend of worship, workshops, a meal-packing service project, and of course, some waterpark fun! A group of 15 also spent a February afternoon skiing and tubing at Sunburst. In March, we enjoyed a movie night at Lighthouse and have been busy preparing for 2 big Easter projects - the Easter baskets for Family Promise and our "Egg My Yard' fundraiser.



We continue to be so grateful to all of our congregations and members who support Lighthouse through prayer as well as financial contributions! Thanks to your generosity, we were able to collect supplies for more than 150 birthday kits to donate to our local food pantries, as well as create some awesome Easter baskets for 25 kids in Ozaukee County through Family Promise. In addition to these special service projects, the ongoing congregational support makes it possible to offer all our fun events to serve our church and community youth. So far this school year, 30 different students have participated in at least one Lighthouse event!

Equipping the Saints Mission Appeal

The ELCA's Greater Milwaukee Synod, of which our congregation is a part, is in the midst of a 3 year campaign to raise \$2.3 million dollars. This campaign expresses confidence that God is at work in the congregations and mission starts of our synod, even as life in the church changes. In partnership with congregations across our synod, we embrace that change and are preparing to lead through becoming more innovative while working together. We seek to raise up and strengthen leaders. We do all of this to make each local congregation more vibrant and vital.

This campaign focuses on 2 activity areas. First, Innovation and Collaboration. This area includes innovation grants to congregations and strengthening Outreach for Hope for a long-term future. Second, Leadership. This includes critical work to invest in racial equity, campus ministry, and our rostered leaders. Finally, in a demonstration that God is a God of abundance and that we can strengthen ourselves and care for others at the same time, both areas include missional tithes for including Lutheran partner ministries churches in El Salvador and Tanzania, Lutheran Social Services, and the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service.
