

Some items get laundered, some spot cleaned, some recycled and some are donated to other causes when we can't use them. Clothes are displayed by the current season, with 'off-season' items getting stored.

Clothing at the pantry is arranged by gender and size, which makes a pleasant and organized shopping experience for all.

When new clients are given a tour of the pantry for the first time, they often remark about how clean and organized the clothing area is.
