Birthday Program

The birthday program distributes birthday presents to seniors over the age of 65 and children between the ages of 0 and 18. Toys, games, hygiene products, clothing, books, and cake supplies are given. We have successfully reached our goal of distributing all new gifts to youth, and are actively working towards a goal of distributing new gifts for seniors as well (excluding books).

Layettes are assembled and given to clients who are expectant mothers. We have made 7 layettes since June of 2024. Included are laundry baskets that contain several sizes of diapers, wipes, different sizes/seasons of clothes, a receiving blanket, books, and when available, feeding items, bathing items, and anything necessary for a baby.

We are actively implementing strategies to enhance our pick-up process. There may still be instances where children and seniors are inadvertently excluded from our system. A suggestion to address this is to provide additional education to volunteers and families regarding our programs. Also, any new items that come into the pantry that can be used as gifts, such as socks, underwear, hygiene items, clothing, blankets, games, and household goods should be directed to the birthday room for distribution.
